Covid 19 Risk Assessment

This risk assessment was undertaken by the Harrogate Over 50's Forum Steering group on the 10th September 2021, to ensure they are taking reasonable steps to reduce the risk of spreading Covid 19 between those attending activities organised by the Forum. The Risk assessment will help manage the risk, and consideration has been given to;

- Identifying what activity or situations might cause transmission of the virus
- Thinking about who might be at risk
- Deciding how likely it is someone could be exposed
- Reviewing the risk assessment needs, should national guidance change
