
We aim to arrive back at about 5.30pm.

Election Meeting April 21st.

A good audience of 80 members gathered in St. Paul's Church Hall to meet the 5 candidates for the Harrogate and District Constituency, and put their questions. Each candidate made a brief opening statement then for an hour, questions came on possible coalition partnerships, proportional representation, discrimination against older people and so on. The second part of the meeting was more of a social meeting with refreshments. All the candidates stayed to talk to many members and hear their opinions.

This hustings meeting was very successful; many people felt they had had a good insight into the issues and the individual candidates. All the candidates complimented the forum on a lively, worthwhile and enjoyable meeting. Perhaps we'll repeat it next time....!

May 21ST. Forum Meeting on "Safety and Security"

Representatives of the Fire Service, the Police Service, Trading Standards and Harrogate Safer Communities Project all came to talk about issues relating to the general concern for greater safety and security for older people. In a very busy and lively meeting we heard a tremendous range of advice to make people aware of 'traditional' crimes as well as newer threats such as phone call and postal scams and particularly doorstep crimes. It was reassuring to hear that the Harrogate District has one the lowest figures in the country for criminal activity. Nonetheless, we must all be on our guard and not hesitate to call the police (tel: 101 for non-emergency matters)

CARERS WEEK June 2015

Harrogate District Forum joined up with Carers Time Off and Carers Resource to highlight the challenges faced by carers and to recognise and celebrate the contribution they make to families and communities throughout the UK.
